4.2	Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans - \$3,000 and Under / Weekly Reclassification Report	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of all active job postings that were opened in the prior week, to recruit and hire new SLCo employees. The Incentive Plan is a list of all recently approved incentive plans that total \$3,000 or less. The Weekly Reclassification Report is a report of all job reclassifications that were completed in the last week.
4.3	Salary and Budget Adjustment Discussion	Analysis of compression in lower grades resulting from move to \$15 minimum in 2022. Review of additional rate adjustments.
6.1	Consideration and Final Approval of an Ordinance of the Legislative Body of Salt Lake County, Utah, Amending Section 2.07.201 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001, Entitled “Conflict of Interest,” and Enacting Section 2.07.210 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001, Entitled “Representation of Salt Lake County’s Interests Before Non-County Entities.”	This proposed amendment addresses two primary matters: 1. lobbyists disclosures in the event they are engaged by another lobbyist or lobbying firm. 2. It clarifies that an individual elected official/office may advocate for their own positions on legislation, while prohibiting an official/office from asserting a county position that is contrary to the county’s position or when the county has not taken a position.
6.2	Consideration of a request to repeal Countywide Policies 1400-4 and 1400-5	The County Information Technology Division would like to repeal Countywide policies 1400-4 and 1400-5. These polices are outdated. The principles in the policies have been updated and added to IT standards. IT Standards are more efficient in covering the quickly changing area of information technology. The County’s IT Standards are backed by Countywide policy 1400, which charges the Information Technology Division with creating IT standards that are then reviewed by the Technology Advisory Board.

The Salt Lake County Health Department Clinical Services agency requests that Council approve the Deseret Industries donation of \$3,500 worth of individual vouchers, to be given in varying amounts according to client need, to qualifying clients as identified by the Salt Lake County Health Department's Parents as Teachers program. The vouchers can be used to purchase clothing or needed household items.

In May 2023 COG Public Works Corridor Preservation Committee approved funding for West Jordan City to purchase a property on 8600 South for a transportation project that will complete the road connecting U-111 and 5600 West. The City purchased the approved property, submitted the necessary documents to the County and is requesting the reimbursement of Corridor Preservation fund awards in the amount of \$847,000
