4.1	The Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans - \$3,000 and Under / Incentive Plans	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of all active job postings that were opened in the prior week, to recruit and hire new SLCo employees. The Incentive Plan Report is a list of all recently approved incentive plans that total \$3,000 or less. The Weekly Reclassification Report is a report of all job reclassifications that were completed in the prior week.
4.2	Budget Adjustment: Public Works Engineering requests to add \$520,000 to their budget to be used for traffic calming at Kearns Elementary and Sams Boulevard. This will be reimbursed by the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District (GSLMSD).	The Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District "GSLMSD" recently added \$520,000 to the Public Works Engineering project budget to be used for traffic calming as follows: EFCMC240011 Traffic Calming Kearns Elementary and Sams Boulevard Project will include speed bumps, raised crossings, and signage. This budget adjustment is budget neutral because project expenses will be reimbursed by the GSLMSD
4.3	Budget Adjustment: This is a post year-end budget adjustment for 2023. The Assessor’s Office requests to shift \$372,323 from personnel budget to establish budget for subscription-based information technology arrangements (SBITAs) for the Thimgan-Prognose Software.	Budget Neutral 2023 Post Year End Appropriation Unit Shift to Establish SBITA for Thimgan-Prognose Software - a software solution that integrates with the appraisal database for multiple regression analysis, sales comparison, property valuation, and assessment defense. We are moving \$331,051 from the Personnel Appropriation Unit to Capital to establish SBITA for Thimgan. We are moving \$41,272 from Personnel Appropriation Unit to Debt Services for 2023 Thimgan SBITA costs.
4.4	Consideration of a Fee Waiver Request for Parking Fees for 2024 Legislative Session	Consideration of a Fee Waiver request not to exceed \$22,800 for parking fees at the Hyatt Regency for members of the Utah State Legislature for the remainder of the 2024 legislative session

<p>6.1</p>	<p>Consideration of Final Adoption of an Ordinance of the Legislative Body of Salt Lake County, Utah Repealing and Replacing Title 18 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001, Entitled “Subdivisions,” in Order to Comprehensively Update the Title to Reflect State Legislative Change, Changes to the Planning and Development Service Provider for Salt Lake County, and to Otherwise Update Salt Lake County Policy on Subdivisions to Reflect Better Principles of Planning, Efficiency, and Affordability, and Making Other Related Changes</p>	<p>Second reading and consideration of an ordinance of the legislative body of Salt Lake County, Utah repealing and replacing Title 18 of the Salt Lake County Code of Ordinances, 2001, Entitled “Subdivisions.” Very few changes have been made to Title 18 since Salt Lake County changed its form of government at the turn of the century, and much has taken place since then, including a major change of government and service provider for what at that time was the unincorporated county. In addition, SB174 was passed during the 2023 Utah Legislative Session that required certain elements be updated to Title 18 by February 1, 2024. MSD Planning, with significant input from the District Attorney’s Office and Mayor’s Office, has prepared a comprehensive update of Salt Lake County’s subdivision ordinances</p>

Joan Woodbury passed away in late 2023. As a founding member of the Ririe-Woodbury Company, Ms. Woodbury was foundational in developing Salt Lake County as a national hub for modern dance and developing many of the services, programs, and venues that are core to the arts & culture community of Salt Lake County today. This fee waiver is requested in acknowledgement of Joan’s lifetime of contributions.</p>
