3.1	Proposed Hire Report / Weekly Reclassification Report / Incentive Plans	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of active job postings to recruit and hire new SLCO employees. A spreadsheet of all completed job reclassifications and a list of all incentive plans that were signed that week.
3.2	Budget Adjustment: Health Department's Request to Recognize a \$900,456 Grant from the State to Expand Mobile and Standing COVID Testing	Health has received the Crisis Workforce Grant (HLT21COVPHCRWS) from the state to expand mobile and standing COVID testing, The grant will fund the testers (temp positions) with a variety of language skills, which will help with outreach efforts in diverse communities. The focus of the testing will be in the areas where the county is experiencing higher rates of COVID cases, with particular emphasis on under resourced communities. The outbreak outreach teams are comprised of testers, vaccinators, case investigators, and resource specialists for those in need of wrap around services. The team will conduct a pre and post survey to evaluate the effectiveness of the interaction with the communities served.

3.3	Budget Adjustment: Health Department's Request to Recognize a \$102,472 Grant to Support Quarantine and Isolation for those that are Not Unsheltered or Experiencing Homelessness.	Health has received additional funding for Grant HLT21PPPHEA from the state to support Q&I for those that are not unsheltered or experiencing homelessness with quarantine and isolation options. It has been shown that throughout this pandemic vulnerable populations are at greater risk of contracting COVID-19, being hospitalized, and dying from COVID-19. This can, in part, be contributed to their living arrangements. Often, vulnerable populations live in multigenerational households without enough bedroom or bathrooms for an infected person to isolate effectively which contributes to the transmission of COVID-19. Practicing isolation by individuals that test positive for COVID-19 is a crucial tool in mitigating the spread of COVID-19. This funding will be used to pay for a hotel room and food during the isolation period for those individuals in need and without other means to isolate effectively. Individuals that participate will be responsible for their own medical care, personal items, medications, additional food costs, and any other incurred costs associated with the stay. Health will contract with the Association for Utah Community Health (AUCH) to manage the program effectively.
3.4	Budget Adjustment: Capital Improvement's Request to Recognize \$1,500,000 from the State for Improvements to the Jordan River Channel at the Brighton Northpoint Diversion Site Near 4500 S	Salt Lake County has been awarded \$1.5 M from the State of Utah to enhance the Jordan River Channel at the Brighton Northpoint Diversion site near 4500 S. This Channel Improvement project will create a new channel with improved Riparian structure, navigability, conveyance, and habitat. The project will begin February 2022 and be mostly completed by June 22, 2022. Murray City and Taylorsville City are project partners donating access to the project and staging area access.
3.5	Budget Adjustment: District Attorney's Request to Use \$11,524 from Restricted Balance Sheet Account for the Purchase of a New PenLink Server	This adjustment is to allocate funds from our restricted account for PenLink system maintenance to a capital account for the purchase of a new server for the system.

3.6	Budget Adjustment: Sheriff's Request to Convert Two Deputy I FTEs into One Sergeant Deputy I FTE With Vehicle and Associated Operating Costs (budget neutral)	The Sheriff's Office Public Safety Bureau is requesting the conversion of two deputy I FTE'S to one sergeant Deputy I FTE with a vehicle and associated operating costs to assist with span of control. One of the current contract agencies reduced security staffing during COVID and has determined that the higher level of service will not be required moving forward. This reduction in service level would allow for the FTE conversion to be budget neutral. This budget adjustment includes an appropriation unit shift from personnel to ops to accommodate the purchase of vehicle, equipment, and ongoing operating costs. The new sergeant FTE will reduce the span of control within the Public Safety Bureau. This requested sergeant allocation is critical to ensure 24/7 supervision and efficient daily operations of the Bureau. With increased requests for law enforcement and security services at County facilities, PSB is looking at a centralized staffing/patrol model, in collaboration with County clients. This model would allow PSB deputies to efficiently be deployed to sites when needed. This sergeant position would be imperative to manage this type of staffing model as it requires additional oversight of existing deputy resources to ensure law enforcement and security coverage to and between the County sites, while also maintaining statutory obligations to the courts and civil process. This position would also ensure consistent and efficient supervision of the PSB deputies serving these sites. This addition would
