4.1	The Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans - \$3,000 and Under / Incentive Plans	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of all active job postings that were opened in the prior week, to recruit and hire new SLCo employees. The Incentive Plan Report is a list of all recently approved incentive plans that total \$3,000 or less. The Weekly Reclassification Report is a report of all job reclassifications that were completed in the prior week.
4.2	Budget Adjustment: Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$75,000 grant from the Utah Office of Economic Development Utah Outdoor Recreation and \$150,000 interfund revenue from the 4th Quarter Transportation Fund to establish a new project repairing sections of Parley's Trail	Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$225,000 in revenue and expense to establish a new project repairing sections of Parley's Trail. The segment to be repaired is 16 years old. The project will address numerous drainage issues, and seal cracks or install new asphalt overlay where necessary. It will provide a safe surface for users and extend the life of the pavement. The funding comes from two sources, the Utah Office of Economic Development Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant (\$75,000) and Office of Regional Development 4th Quarter transportation funding (\$150,000). This project was presented to the Council as one of the 4th Quarter Local Option Sales Tax transportation projects approved on 12/12/23
4.3	Budget Adjustment: Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$2,720,320 in interfund revenue from the 4th Quarter Transportation Fund for the Butterfield Trailhead Phase 2 project.	Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$2,720,320 in revenue and expense for the Butterfield Trailhead Phase 2 project. As the Butterfield Trailhead Phase 1 project nears completion, this additional funding for Phase 2 would allow for a more comprehensive buildout of the area. The project would include the equestrian entry road, trailhead parking area, trailhead amenities, maintenance building (excluding the restroom portion), and necessary utilities. This project was presented by the Office of Regional Development as one of the 4th Quarter Local Option Sales Tax transportation projects approved by the Council on 12/12/23. No new County dollars are requested

4.4	Budget Adjustment: Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$250,000 in interfund revenue from the 4th Quarter Transportation Fund for the Bridge Decking replacement project on the Jordan River Trail at the 2320 S trailhead	<p>Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$250,000 in revenue and expense to set up a project replacing the bridge decking on the Jordan River Trail at the 2320 South trailhead. Removal of existing planking and replacing with new planking will provide safe east-west passage over the river.</p> <p>This project was presented by the Office of Regional Development as one of the 4th Quarter Local Option Sales Tax transportation projects approved by the Council on 12/12/23. No new County dollars are requested</p>
4.5	Budget Adjustment: Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$680,000 in interfund revenue from the 4th Quarter Transportation Fund for phases 5 & 6 of the Utah and Salt Lake Canal Trail.	<p>Parks and Recreation requests to recognize \$680,000 in revenue and expense for the Utah and Salt Lake Canal Trail.</p> <p>This project was presented by the Office of Regional Development as one of the 4th Quarter Local Option Sales Tax transportation projects approved by the Council on 12/12/23. This funding provides the local match needed to receive additional State funds to complete phases five and six of the trail.</p> <p>No new County dollars are requested.</p>
