3.1	Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans under \$3,000 / Weekly Reclassification Report	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of active job postings to recruit and hire new SLCO employees. The Incentive Plans Report is a list of all incentive plans under \$3,000 that were signed that week and the Weekly Reclassification Report is a spreadsheet of all completed job reclassifications.
3.2	Budget Adjustment: Mayor's Finance's Request for Technical True-up of the 2022 Capital Projects	This adjustment will true-up the capital project placeholder amounts with the actual available budgets.
3.3	Granite School District Presentation on Possible Boundary Changes and Closures	As part of state law, Granite School District is obligated to provide a formal notification to local elected officials (including county council members) in order to adjust or change school boundaries and/or close schools. Granite School District is in the process of evaluating both boundary changes and school closures. They will present a brief 10 minute presentation and answer any questions Council Members may have about possible boundary changes and closures.
3.4	Agreement with Juma Entertainment, LLC. for the Donation of the Renovation of Salt Lake City Sports Complex (~\$100,000)	The renovation of the Salt Lake City Sports Complex is being donated (~\$100,000) on behalf of figure skating champion and Salt Lake native, Nathan Chen, as part of the CBS TV series, Secret Celebrity Renovation. Parks & Recreation is seeking approval from the Council for the agreement with Juma Entertainment, LLC for the donation and renovation.

		• Combined total of \$830,606 will cover the hourly increase of \$3 more per hour, to allow the following:
		o \$11-14/hour during lifeguard training
		o \$14-18/hour once certified as a lifeguard depending on experience; starting wage of \$15.55 once trained if no previous experience
		o \$16-19/hour for trained/certified swim instructors
