6.2	First Reading of an Ordinance of the Legislative of Salt Lake County, Utah, Creating an Appeal Hearing Board to Hear and Decide Appeals Regarding the County Recorder’s Application of Rules Made by the County Recorder Standards Board, and Making Other Related Changes	The County Recorder needs to establish an appeal board and process as a requirement of the state’s County Recorders Standards Board. This is the first reading of the ordinance. Formal adoption may occur at the July 11, 2023 Council Meeting

6.3	Consideration of a Three Year Renewal of the Salt Lake County HOME Consortium Agreement with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development	Every three years, the County HOME Investment Partnership Housing Program Consortium is required to renew the established consortium of which the members are Salt Lake County as the lead entity, Sandy City, South Jordan City, Taylorsville City, West Jordan City, and West Valley City. This renewal, evidenced by the Interlocal Agreement, is due to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development by June 30, 2023. This allows the Consortium to receive an annual allocation of HOME funds for affordable housing activities.
6.4	Consideration of the Cultural Core Year 6 Review and Year 7 Activity & Spending Plan	Per the Cultural Core Interlocal between Salt Lake City and Salt Lake County, the Cultural Core Implementation Manager (Downtown SLC Presents) makes an annual presentation to the County Council to provide an overview of the previous year's activity and to seek approval for the upcoming year's spending plan and activity. The Cultural Core Budget Committee approved the proposed Year 7 budget that is now being presented to County Council for final approval
7.1	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Approving the Recommendation of the Salt Lake County Council of Governments and Authorizing the Execution of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Providing for the Transfer of \$56,471 of County Corridor Preservation Funds to the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District to be Used to Acquire Certain Property Within the Kearns Metro Township for Transportation Purposes	The Council of Governments Public Works Committee approved funding in November 2020 for Kearns to purchase 15 parcels needed for a 4700 South road construction project. The MSD/Kearns acquired all of the parcels and is requesting reimbursement
7.2	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Approving Execution of an Amended Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Holladay City Providing for the Transfer of County Transportation Funds for a Certain Transportation Project Within Salt Lake County	In December 2022, the Council approved an allocation to Holladay City in the amount of \$600,000 for the Wasatch Blvd. Buffered Bike Lane and Multi-Use Path project. This revised ILA provides for the modification of project limits on Wasatch Blvd from 4500 South to 6200 South to Fortuna Way to 6200 South.
7.3	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Approving Execution of an Amended Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Millcreek City Providing for the Transfer of County Transportation Funds for a Certain Transportation Project Within Salt Lake County	In December 2022, the Council approved an allocation to Holladay City in the amount of \$4,500,000 for the Wasatch Blvd Shared Use Path project. In 2021, Holladay and Millcreek received funding from the WFRC Transportation and Land Use Connection for a Holladay and Millcreek Wasatch Boulevard Master Plan. Holladay and Millcreek have agreed to have Millcreek manage the implementation of the project and the \$4,500,000 4th Quarter award will be transferred from Holladay to Millcreek. Additionally, the project limits will be modified from 3680 South to 4500 South to 3300 South to Fortuna Way

7.4	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Authorizing Execution of an Agreement Between Salt Lake County and the Utah Arts Alliance Regarding the Wild Wild Westside Arts Fest	Proposal of resolution for Salt Lake County Council to approve an agreement with Utah Arts Alliance to put on an activation event at the Mid-Valley Performing Arts Center called Wild Wild Westside Arts Fest and share revenues
7.5	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Approving and Authorizing Execution of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Between Salt Lake County and University of Utah for a Contribution in the amount of \$150,000.00 of TRCC Funds to Help Fund UofU Film & Media Arts Modern Cinema	Approval of a resolution of the Salt Lake County Council authorizing execution of an interlocal agreement between Salt Lake County and University of Utah for a contribution in the amount of \$150,000.00 of TRCC funds to help fund UofU Film & Media Arts Modern Cinema.
7.6	Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Declaring Surplus Real Property and Authorizing Execution of the Attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the United Fire Authority and Related Documents	In 2009, the County transferred its interest in certain real property located in Magna, Utah, known as the Training Fire Station to the Salt Lake Valley Fire Service Area through an Interlocal Agreement with a reversionary clause stating that title to the Training Fire Station would immediately and automatically revert to and revert in the County if the Property was no longer used as a fire training station. SLVFSA was a special service area in Salt Lake County created in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah and became known as the Unified Fire Service Area in 2013. UFSA is a member of the Unified Fire Authority. In May 2023, UFSA, with the consent of the County and subject to the same reversionary clause, transferred title of the Training Fire Station to UFA. Six manufactured homes purchased by the County to be used as temporary office space had been placed at the Training Fire Station prior to the 2009 conveyance and remained at the Training Fire Station after the conveyance. Since 2009, these Manufactured Homes have been and are currently utilized in a permanent capacity by UFA at the Training Fire Station. The Manufactured Homes are currently permanently affixed to the ground and combined into office space, and title to the Manufactured Homes should have transferred to SLVFSA or UFA as part of the Training Fire Station Agreement. The Manufactured Homes currently provide no specific value to the County and should be disposed of as surplus property. UFA has requested that the County transfer title to the Manufactured Homes to UFA so that it can continue to utilize the Manufactured Homes at the Training Fire Station. In accordance with Title 11, Chapter 13 of the Utah Code, UFA and the County have prepared an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement to accomplish the transfer of the Manufactured Homes to UFA. The County has determined that it is in the public interest to enter into the Agreement with UFA and transfer the Manufactured Homes to UFA as provided in the Agreement

<p>7.7</p>	<p>Consideration of a Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Declaring Surplus Real Property and Approving the Conveyance of the Same by Quit Claim Deed to RW Woodside LLC</p>	<p>Salt Lake County owns a parcel of real property, located at approximately 4105 South Highland Drive, Holladay, UT 84124, which was struck off to the County after the tax sale in 2002. RW Woodside, LLC (“RW”), has offered in writing to purchase the Property from County for the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), which amount has been approved by the Salt Lake County Real Estate Section as fair market value. This offer is in the form of a Tax Sale Property Purchase Agreement (“Agreement”) attached hereto as Exhibit A. County has determined that the Property is not in public use. Proceeds from the sale of the Property will be distributed in accordance with Section 59-2-1351.5 of the Utah Code. It has been determined that the best interest of County and the public will be served by the sale and conveyance of the Property to RW. The sale and conveyance will follow all applicable state statutes and county ordinances</p>
