The Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District (GSLMSD) recently added \$491,000 to the Public Works Engineering (PWE) project budget as follows: EFCMC210017, 80th West Widening, \$16,000 for revisions to environmental document EFCMC230007, Western Drive Sidewalk, \$50,000 for design work EFCMC230008, 8400 W Rail Crossing, \$200,000 for design work EFCMC230009, Magna Main Reconstruct, \$150,000 for design work EFCMC230010, 8000 W SR201 Turn Lane, \$75,000 to construct roadway improvement to address safety issue. This budget adjustment is budget neutral because project expenses will be reimbursed by the GSLMSD.

<p>4.4</p>	<p>Budget Adjustment: Public Works Engineering requests to add \$1,105,518 to their revenue and expense budgets for multiple projects in Emigration Canyon, which will be reimbursed by the GSLMSD.</p>	<p>The Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District (GSLMSD) recently added \$1,105,518 to the Public Works Engineering (PWE) project budget as follows: EFCMC210020, Canyon Slope Stabilization, \$1,576,971, being used for construction CI6120012, Emigration Slope Stabilization, (\$45,070), being consolidated into Canyon Slope Stabilization EFCMC210013, Killyons Canyon Overlay, (\$143), project completed EFCMC210008, Emigration Canyon Road Widening, (15,000),being consolidated into Canyon Slope Stabilization CI_120019, Killyons Canyon, (\$159,715), project completed EFCMC210014, Pinecrest Overlay, (\$179,545), project completed EFCMC190007, Margarethe Road Stabilization, (\$71,980), extra funds being transferred to Canyon Slope Stabilization This budget adjustment is budget neutral because project expenses will be reimbursed by the GSLMSD</p>
<p>4.5</p>	<p>Budget Adjustment: This is a technical adjustment to create a time-limited, grant funded FTE to support the new Federal Communications Commission (FCC) grant that the Office of Regional Development (ORD) has been awarded to provide low-income residents access to broadband internet services.</p>	<p>At the June 2023 budget adjustment the position to support the new FCC Grant was approved for the budget amount by the positions was not entered in for the budgeted amount. This is a technical adjustment to create the time limited positions that belongs to the already approved budget.</p>

4.6	Budget Adjustment: The Office of Homelessness and Criminal Justice Reform has been awarded \$30,000 from the Utah Broadband Center to increase and support digital access in the community. This is to add the grant to their revenue and expense budget.	The Office of Homelessness and Criminal Justice Reform (OHCJR), was awarded a digital access planning grant from the Utah Broadband Center for a total of \$30,000 to focus on creating a plan to increase and support digital access in the community. This planning grant was announced as a “pre-grant”, and they are planning on releasing another RFP for the awarded organizations to implement their plans. The overall goal of the Utah Broadband center was to find organizations that work with their different target populations, we were awarded to focus specifically on individuals who have been or are currently incarcerated. They have created a Digital Connectivity plan for the state and would like to include the plans from the awarded organizations in their larger one. Here is a link to their site that shows the one they just released: Digital Connectivity Plan Connect Utah (connectingutah.com) (OHCJR) is currently partnered with Chief Dumont at the SLCo Jail to help reach our target population. He will survey the inmates using an established tablet system in the jail cells, and plan to complete the surveys by July 20th. The Salt Lake City Library is ready to move forward with digital literacy classes that we would like to use a large portion of the grant funds to support this by paying out a stipend. They will be holding these classes at different resource centers around Salt Lake City and will survey the individuals to have a better understanding of the target population and their needs. Finally, we will use these funds to provide food for different focus groups and gain additional knowledge on gaps in digital literacy and access. We have until 08/01/2023 to spend down these funds to support the planning process. We will not use these funds for payroll support.

Every three years the county must recertify as an Urban County and provide documentation on which cities and towns are involved in the three-year recertification. The interlocal agreement outlines the terms and conditions for the next three-year period (program years 2024-2026).
