3.1	Proposed Hire Report / Incentive Plans under \$3,000 / Weekly Reclassification Report	The Proposed Hire Report is a weekly report of active job postings to recruit and hire new SLCO employees. The Incentive Plans Report is a list of all incentive plans under \$3,000 that were signed that week and the Weekly Reclassification Report is a spreadsheet of all completed job reclassifications
3.2	Budget Adjustment: The Library Requests a Fund Transfer Between Capital Projects	<p>Transfer \$62,800 from the "Sandy fire suppression system" capital project to the "Whitmore roof membrane replacement" project.</p> <p>The updated quote for the Whitmore project came in higher than budgeted. Sandy's bid also came in higher. The Whitmore roof is a higher priority, so we are requesting a funds transfer. The Sandy fire suppression project will be delayed until a future year.</p> <p>Additionally, the Whitmore flashing capital project (LIBWHIMETALROOF) is being combined with the Whitmore roof membrane replacement project as they are both related to the same work.</p> <p>Request is net neutral</p>
3.3	Budget Adjustment: The DA’s Office Requests a One-Time Contribution of \$4,000 to Wheels of Justice by Transferring Available Funds from Another Expenditure Account in Their Budgets.	<p>This contribution to Wheels of Justice is to assist in covering fees to host the 5 Canyons Bike Challenge event including essential public safety services along roadways.</p> <p>Proceeds from cycling and race entries to be donated to 4 local charities: Friends of the SLCO Children's Justice Center nonprofit, Prevent Child Abuse Utah, Utah, and Domestic Violence Coalition and Justice For All.</p>

<p>3.4</p>	<p>Budget Adjustment: The Health Department Requests 0.75 FTE Time-Limited Position to Expand the Suicide Prevention Program.</p>	<p>The Health Department has been awarded \$95,000 annually for 3 years from Utah State Substance Abuse and Mental Health to expand suicide prevention program. This position will be 100% funded by the state from October 2022-June 2025.</p> <p>This position's tasks include: Develop a written suicide prevention plan for Salt Lake County that is in alignment with the state plan; Develop a written postvention response plan in alignment with the Utah Community Postvention Toolkit; Serve as the postvention response coordinator to assist schools, worksites, community organizations, etc. in providing support and resources after a death by suicide; Review and update submitted plans; Provide more Postvention support for communities within Salt Lake County.</p>
<p>3.5</p>	<p>Budget Adjustment: The Health Department Requests 6 Merit Positions.</p>	<p>During the 2022 General Session, Utah State Legislation approved a funding increase (\$4M statewide) to support Minimum Performance Standards (Utah Admin. Code, R380-40) for local health departments. The Salt Lake County allocation is a \$814K increase. The intent is for expansion and improvement and cannot be used to supplant other funding sources, including County funding.</p> <p>With this additional funding, the Health Department requests 6 merit positions to expand and improve the services to meet the required Minimum Performance Standards set by the state. Since this new additional funding is now written to the code, the funding proves to be stable so the positions will be merit instead of time limited</p>

4.1	A Resolution of the Salt Lake County Council Approving Execution of an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Taylorsville City and the Conveyance of Surplus County Property in the Public Use to Taylorsville City	Salt Lake County owns several parcels of real property in Taylorsville City known as Taylorsville Park and Skyview Detention Basin Park, which are in the public use as public parks. Taylorsville City has requested the County enter an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for the County to convey the Parks to the City. The Salt Lake County Council held a public hearing on December 8, 2020, and by resolution declared the Parks surplus and available for disposal. It has been determined that the best interests of the County and the general public will be served by execution of the attached Interlocal Cooperation Agreement and the conveyance of the Parks to Taylorsville. The conveyances will comply with all applicable state statutes and County ordinances.
