UFA also provides, through its Emergency Management Division, county-wide emergency management services directly to the County pursuant to a separate interlocal cooperation agreement and currently uses approximately 18% of the ECC to provide these services to the County. The County is willing to lease to the UFA on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth. Pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, UTAH CODE ANN §11-13-101, et seq., the parties desire Lease to describe and delineate the scope of their mutual cooperation as to the matters addressed herein.
