Two-Page Ballots for the 2024 General Election

As the largest county in Utah and home to over half a million registered voters, **Salt Lake County will issue two-page ballots for the first time in the upcoming 2024 General Election**. The extensive ballot is designed to accommodate a broad range of federal, state, county, and local issues and give voters the opportunity to express their preferences at multiple levels of government. This election will include 179 candidates across 88 contests, as well as important bond measures and constitutional amendments.

This year's ballot consists of two double-sided pages. Each page is clearly labeled to help voters ensure they voted on and will return both pages, as well as help with internal processing of the ballots. Page 1 will feature a blue box labeled "1 of 2" in the upper right-hand corner, while Page 2 will have an orange box labeled "2 of 2" in the upper right-hand corner.

Voters are encouraged to carefully review both sides of each page and ensure they fill out and return both pages in their signed ballot return envelope to ensure all votes are counted.

Ballots will be mailed out starting the week of October 15, ahead of Election Day on November 5, 2024.

Youth Government

Welcome Youth Government Mayor Schwankl and Deputy Mayor Dvoretskiy!

On October 10, 2024, Youth Government successfully held its latest election, resulting in Sophie Schwankl being elected as this year's Mayor. Her primary advocacy focus will address the fentanyl crisis, marking a significant shift from her previous advocacy on airsoft gun usage policies in public parks, a topic she passionately presented to various municipalities across Salt Lake County.

Eva Dvoretskiy was elected Deputy Mayor and will prioritize increased funding, educational opportunities, and resources for refugees in Salt Lake County, a cause she deeply cares about after her work with refugees learning English. The newly elected Council Members—Aashita Mandiwal, Adwita Mandiwal, Daniel Dustin, Emily Dustin, Daniel Whalen, Julia Fazzino, and Wild Violet Badger—bring a diverse range of advocacy topics to the table, focusing on air quality, mental health, suicide prevention, and drug usage among youths.

Additionally, our senior members, Julia and Wild Violet, are committed to helping Youth Government grow by implementing more service projects and enhancing recruitment strategies. This election marks an exciting new chapter for Youth Government as we strive to address pressing issues and engage our community more effectively.

Growing young leaders is so important! The Salt Lake County Youth Government is an excellent opportunity for Salt Lake County middle school and high school students to learn more about their government. They also develop leadership, advocacy, and service skills through hands-on experience.

Get Involved in Youth Government

Public Safety Bond: \$507 million (Salt Lake County, Utah Local Special Bond Election)

Building a Justice and Accountability Center:

- The Justice and Accountability Center is an alternative to jail primarily for low-level offenders who are repeatedly involved in the criminal justice system because of underlying issues, such as unstable housing and mental health and substance use disorders that have not been addressed
- The Justice and Accountability Center will connect people to outpatient treatment, job training, permanent housing opportunities, and support services to get their lives back on track with a goal of eliminating criminal behavior

Consolidating and Improving the County Jail by:

- Combining the two county jails
- Increasing the number of beds
- Expanding access to mental health treatment

Building a reentry unit to help people leaving jail prepare to rejoin society

The jail costs \$136/day per person—the Justice and Accountability Center will cost \$75/day per person, a \$60/day savings to taxpayers.

Public Safety Bond

Zoo, Arts, & Parks (ZAP) Tax

The Zoo, Arts, and Parks (ZAP) tax was approved by voters in 1996 and went into effect on January 1, 1997. Every ten years since, voters have voted in favor or reauthorizing the ZAP tax. The ZAP tax is on the ballot this November and, if approved by voters, the tax will continue another ten years, beginning January 1, 2027.

What ZAP funds:

 The mission of the Zoo, Arts, and Parks (ZAP) Program is to grant ZAP tax funds to art, cultural, botanical, and zoological organizations. ZAP also funds parks and recreation projects in Salt Lake County. Thirty percent of ZAP tax revenues support Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation operations and projects.

How much is the ZAP tax and is it going up?

- The Zoo, Arts, and Parks (ZAP) tax funds a variety of arts and culture programs in our community. It also funds parks and recreation projects in cities and towns around the county, as well as Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation operations and projects.
- The ZAP tax is one penny for every \$10 spent within the county, which
 equals 0.1 percent. If approved by the voter it will be a continuation of the ZAP
 tax, not a tax increase.
