
Please join me April 19th

Faces of Salt Lake County

Salt Lake County has long been a light for New Americans welcoming them into its communities and neighborhoods. While Salt Lake County has experienced overall population growth, the surge in the number of people born in other countries is noteworthy, with an increase of over 9%. This County is where more than half of the state's two hundred fifty thousand New Americans reside. Recently the County warmly received hundreds of Afghan and Ukrainian refugees, with a considerable majority settling in the County's western regions. Their presence continues to transform Salt Lake County into a vibrant mosaic of cultures, languages, and stories. Students in the

County's school districts alone speak an astonishing 125 languages, a testament to the diverse heritage they bring.

The mission of the Salt Lake County Office of New Americans (ONA) is to improve the lives of new American residents by maximizing civic, social, and economic potential. In a continued effort to bridge all gaps in our community, ONA hopes this book, Faces of Salt Lake County, will foster an environment of inclusivity and belonging. ONA asked youth groups, including the Salt Lake County Youth Government and Salt Lake County 4-H Teen Council, to interview Salt Lake County residents. These young participants underwent training sessions, workshops, and other activities aimed at strengthening the county's social cohesion. These teens learned about the collective experiences of those with whom they spoke. In these pages, you will learn their stories, and see their faces as photographed by award-winning Utah photographer Bry Cox. This book illuminates the rich histories, unique cultures, and significant contributions of Salt Lake County's immigrant, non-immigrant, and refugee residents.

This project is more than just a compilation of stories. It is a tangible representation of integration, collaboration, and community spirit. All proceeds from the sale of this book will assist immigrants with citizenship application fees and green card expenses. In essence, the Faces of Salt Lake County project is a testament to what can be achieved when a community comes together. As you delve into the stories within, you will discover not just individual tales of perseverance and hope, but a collective narrative of a county that seeks to uplift, include, and celebrate every one of its residents.


During a time of extreme division, this book aims to unite all residents of Salt Lake County

We welcome all, we value all, and we are pleased to know these individuals as our friends, co-workers, and neighbors.
